## *Teacher of the Year 2016*

Stratford Public Schools, in conjunction with the Stratford Board of Education, the Stratford Education Association, and the Connecticut State Department of Education, is participating in the National Teacher of the Year Program. We will nominate one of our tenured, full time teachers for this distinction. This person will represent our best. Any tenured, full-time classroom teacher, including those in special areas, is eligible for nomination. Teachers nominated in prior years but not selected as Teacher of the Year are eligible for re-nomination.

### *Regulations:*

In agreement with the Board and the Stratford Education Association, these regulations govern the 2016 Teacher of the Year nominations:

1. Only adults are able to nominate teachers.
2. You can nominate only one **tenured**, full-time teacher each year.
3. A nomination requires two signatures. **One must be that of a certified staff member.**
4. Nominators must have had contact with the tenured, full-time teacher they nominate within the past three years.
5. The Teacher of the Year selection committee will consist of the present Teacher of the Year, two Stratford Education Association members, one Stratford Administrator Association member, one Board of Education member, one parent representative, one central office administrative representative, and the program coordinator.
6. The nominated teacher must be an exceptionally skilled and dedicated professional who exemplifies the pillars of character. This teacher plans to continue in an active teaching status.

*If you wish to nominate a teacher, complete the nomination form on the attached sheet. Every effort will be made to keep the names of the nominators confidential.*

***Nominations must be received at Flood Middle School by 3:00 p.m. on Friday, May 15, 2015. Late arrivals will not be considered.***

4. Be poised and articulate.
5. Be an exceptionally skilled and dedicated professional who exemplifies the pillars of character and plans to continue in an active teaching status.
6. Have played a useful role in his/her community and is active in civic and humanitarian activities.
7. Have a philosophy of teaching that includes the roles and goals of teachers and have suggestions for bringing about positive changes in education.
8. Serve on committees and task forces; attend or conduct workshops or seminars in the field.
